COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is designed to expose students to a broad spectrum of topics in Earth, Ocean, Atmosphere and Planetary Sciences. Seminar speakers will talk about their recent research achievements and other related topics.

Course Objectives: It is the goal of this course that students will:

- Learn about cutting edge research in Earth, Ocean, Atmosphere and Planetary Sciences.
- Briefly convey the primary "take-home" messages from the lectures, in written form

COURSE MATERIALS

There are no specified materials for this course, though some speakers may choose to make selected articles available

ASSESSMENTS AND GRADING

The grade will be based on submission of 12 brief seminar reports during the semester. Requirements for seminar summaries are outlined below:

- 1) After each Department seminar, write a short (1/2 page, single-spaced) report, listing and briefly discussing the most important points of the presentation. Twelve (12) reports are due during the semester. A list of speakers is posted on the Geological Sciences website and titles will be posted as they are received.

- 3) Most seminars will be hosted by Geological Sciences, but now and then we may designate a seminar hosted by another department or center (e.g. Biology, Water Institute, Climate Institute) as our official seminar for the week. The same reporting guidelines apply.

- 4) E-mail the report (as a Word file) to me at brenner@ufl.edu before the following week's seminar. Include your name and the speaker's name in the subject line containing your report. Please do the same for the file name, e.g. Jones (Smith seminar).docx.
- 5) If you cannot join a seminar, contact me to arrange a make-up or substitution. You can substitute another campus seminar if you arrange to do so ahead of time, and if you identify interesting seminars in other units, by all means, attend them. But please do your best to attend GLY seminars, as we want to show speakers the courtesy of our presence. Please submit reports in a timely fashion.
